Responsibilities of a Penetrant Testing Level 2 certified NDT professional

An individual certified to Penetrant Testing Level 2 has demonstrated competence to perform NDT according to NDT procedures. Within the scope of the competence defined on the certificate, Level 2 personnel may be authorised by the employer to:

- Select the Penetrant Testing technique for the test method to be used
- Define the limitations of application of the testing method
- Translate Penetrant Testing codes, standards, specifications and procedures into Penetrant Testing instructions adapted to the actual working conditions
- Set up and verify Penetrant Testing equipment settings

- Perform and supervise Penetrant tests
- Interpret and evaluate results according to applicable standards, codes, specifications or procedures
- Prepare written Penetrant Testing instructions
- Carry out and supervise all tasks at or below Level 2
- Provide guidance for personnel at or below Level 2
- Report the results of Penetrant tests.

Training and experience hours required for Certification

Full PCN certification is only achieved once the required experience is acquired following the completion of the required training hours and passing of the examination:

Level 2 – 24 training hours and 3 months experience if Level 1 held or 40 training hours and 4 months experience if direct to Level 2
